To celebrate the Year of Mercy, we have expanded our mission to include small projects for health care. People who are poor in Tanzania suffer pain and disease because of inadequate medical care, and we highlight opportunities to assist St. Francis Rwambaizi Health Center in this issue.



Yet providing an excellent Catholic education for young people in Tanzania remains our main mission. We currently sponsor over 100 students in pre-school through university. We also sponsor two nursing students and a medical student, as we help train workers to meet

the country's health care needs. And COHF has expanded to include sponsorship at public schools for children who cannot attend Catholic school for health reasons or due to learning disabilities and also for post high school education.

We continue to be most grateful for the generosity of our sponsors, donors and volunteers who make our work possible. You make a huge difference in the lives of the young people and communities we serve in the Kagera Region of Tanzania.

HEALTH CARE IN TANZANIA: AN INITIATIVE FOR THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

St. Francis Health Center is located in the rural area of Karagwe and is operated by the Diocese of Kayanga under the supervision of Sacred Heart Parish and the Franciscan Sisters of St. Bernadette. The center has a capacity for 56 beds. It provides health care for over 85,000 people within its area and has outreach to six neighboring villages. Health services are delivered mainly to pregnant women and children. However, transportation of health personnel to the villages and transport of patients to the health center is a big problem because of a lack of reliable ambulance service.

St. Francis Health Center serves a very poor population. The main diseases treated at the health facility are malaria, diarrhea, pneumonia, typhoid, worms, urinary track infection, HIV/Aids, STDs, anemia and peptic ulcers. Children from poor families suffer from malnutrition, diarrhea, and low immune systems. Many children die of malnutrition and preventable diseases including malaria and pneumonia.

The patients cannot afford to pay for health care and therefore the center has difficulty in staffing medical personnel and providing basic health care. The facility was originally built in 1960 by the Missionary Sisters and is in need of major renovations.

St. Francis Health Center is in need of the very basics – ambulance service, electricity, repair of water tanks, latrines, medicine and medical equipment. The Health Center is vital for this area, providing hope for cures from different diseases and alleviating pain and suffering. Please consider donating to this health care initiative as we begin the Jubilee Year of Mercy.
