A heartfelt huge thank you to all who contributed to the water and sanitation project for St. Augustine Primary School! It is an amazing accomplishment! The school was saved from being closed for health hazards and they were able to start the new school year in January. There is now an adequate supply of clean water for drinking, cooking, laundry and good hygiene (Picture above of children drawing water). The lavatories with toilets and bath facilities are in the process of being painted and the sewage system is nearly completed. Bishop Almachius, the principal, and entire school are most grateful for your loving support and quick response to the crisis. This was truly an act of mercy for an extremely poor Catholic school.

We currently have 157 students sponsored through COHF. The hope is that all the children will reach their full potential. Our children are in primary school (62), secondary school (70), higher education programs (15) and in the seminary (10).

In this newsletter we highlight our sponsorship program. COHF is making a significant impact in the lives of our sponsored children to give them the opportunity for a good future. PROJECTS AND UPDATES



ANGEL HOME ORPHANAGE

Support of Angel Home Orphanage comprises over half of the Corporal Works of Mercy including Feed the hungry; Give drink to the thirsty; Clothe the naked and Shelter the homeless. Orphans receive an excellent education which includes the Spiritual Work of Mercy to instruct the uninformed. Thank you to those who gave to the end of the year appeal to support the orphanage and provide tuition for children to attend school. We have 35 children from Angel Home sponsored in primary (24) and secondary schools (11) who return home to the orphanage during school vacations. The Franciscan Sisters give daily care to ~20 children who range in age from infants to 4 years old. The sisters have requested more assistance from COHF with the expenses for food, clothes, medical care and transportation of the children to and from schools.

ST. JOSEPH GIRLS' DORMITORY UPDATE

St. Joseph Secondary School is the main Catholic high school where we have sponsored students in the Rulenge-Ngara Diocese. Thank you to all who contributed to the girls' dormitory project! Fr. Jeremiah, the principal, was very happy with the \$6,000 he received toward the project. The good news is that construction has begun. However, they are still in need of the remaining \$11,900 to finish the project. Please consider helping the school to admit more girls for secondary education. It is very important that girls continue their education after graduation from




Some of our sponsored students at St. Joseph Secondary School. Six Form IV students graduated in November.

St. Francis Rwambaizi Health Center is in the process of purchasing the ultrasound machine and setting up the outreach program. Sr. Dorosella, a Franciscan Sister of St. Bernadette and nurse, is most grateful and filled with joy. Lives will be saved as she will be able to provide better medical care to pregnant women and their young children because of your immense generosity.
